Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

During the last two weeks of July, our modem stopped working. At our house, you would have thought the world was coming to an end. How are we to get anything done without an internet connection? How are we going to entertain ourselves without cable? How do we connect with other people without the phone line working?

It took this disruption for me to realize how much I have turned the internet into an idol, a god. A god and an idol that disconnects me from my relationship with God and my neighbor. An idol that draws me away from Jesus Christ and leads me to trust in something else other than God.

What did I/we do for two weeks without the internet at our house? We prioritized what was truly important to us—our relationship with God in Jesus Christ through reading the Word of God revealed in the Holy Scriptures and daily prayer, spending more intentional time to connect with one another as a family and with our neighbors (including our neighbors who live next door to us) and to spend some time in God's creation through gardening.







Even with the best intentions, these priorities (what we deem is important in our lives) can become an idol or mini god to themselves.

In the Large Catechism, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther writes this in explanation in response to the first commandment, "You are to have no other gods": 'A "god" is the term for that to which we are look for all good and in which we are to find refuge in all need. Therefore, to have a god is nothing else than to trust and believe in that one with your whole heart. As I have often said, it is the truest and faith of the heart alone that makes both God and an idol. If your faith and trust are right, then your God is the true one. Conversely, where your trust is false and wrong, there you do not have the true God."





Ultimately, it comes down to, who do we trust? As we examine our own conscience, what does our individual and communal heart(s) cling to? All of the things I mentioned earlier as priorities (reading my Bible, connecting with my family and gardening in God's creation), are good things to do. These things by themselves can be turned into idols or god(s) by themselves, when we seek refuge, comfort and help from them; instead of putting our trust in God through Jesus Christ, who is Savior and Lord of all.

Luther continues,"It is God alone from whom we receive everything good and by whom we are delivered from all evil." 2

Only through Jesus Christ are we delivered from all evil and freed from all the things we have made into gods and idols. Yes, there might be some short term happiness created by our idols and gods. However, these things will never bring us everlasting joy.

When we speak of idolatry, we must be careful and on guard to not make church an idol or god. It may be true that coming to worship on Sunday mornings in person or online might make us "feel good" for the rest of the week. We might enjoy connecting with other Christians in the body of Christ. We might like certain hymns or worship services more than others. We might like the sermons preached (or not). We might enjoy doing projects together.

At the end of the day, none of the things I listed above that we might do as a church is the reason the Church gathers. The Church first and foremost gathers to teach and preach Christ crucified and risen, as we gather around Word and Sacrament ministry. Everything else then becomes secondary. Family, friends, traditions, doing service projects, etc. will not deliver us from the evil of this world. These cannot bring about the forgiveness of sins because the emphasis on what human beings can do; instead of trusting and relying upon the one true God embodied in Jesus Christ.

Only by the power of the Holy Spirit are we able to trust and believe in God's promise fulfilled in Jesus Christ. With faith, comes obedience. Obedience to God alone and not to oneself. Faith in Christ enables us to let go of our control and to recognize God's presence through Jesus Christ, in the midst of our ordinary lives with ordinary people.

If there is a silver lining to 2020, it is that with the disruption caused by COVID19; God invites us to deeper opportunities to recognize Christ is in our midst. And to recognize that all that we do is not about making ourselves full of hubris; or using the works to save ourselves spiritually. It is about what God is doing in Jesus Christ who is in our midst, in all circumstances, and forgiving and loving us unconditionally. It is about trusting in God's promise embodied in Jesus Christ; from which all of our words and actions flow as derivatives of God's love in Jesus Christ. It is about God's salvation fulfilled in Jesus Christ, and only by the power of the Holy Spirit are we able to come to trust and believe in Christ.

Here we stand before God. We lay down our idols and gods at the base of the cross; at Jesus' feet. We hear Christ' words, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." There is death and there is resurrection. There is life and there is death.

Death no longer has dominion, for everything that is old has passed away. All things are made new in Jesus Christ. Once again, we look forward to not only the salvation we receive in the future to come; we live in the present—trusting in God's mercy, love and forgiveness abound in Christ alone.


